GAME RULES ADDENDUM

All games will be played by USSSA rules, with the following exceptions:

1. MYBallClub.com will be scoring the games, there is no need to have a scorebook.
2. The tournament will provide all game balls and umpire fees.
3. Pre-game conference and coin flip between manager and umpires will take place 5 minutes prior to the start of the game.
4. All equipment must be USSSA approved (bats), no metal cleats are allowed.
5. No organized infield practice before the games. Teams may warm up beyond the baselines or in foul territory. No live batting practice is allowed on the field or in the complex at any time.
6. Time limit for all games is 75 minutes, finish the inning. Time begins after the pre-game conference. Time limit could change in case of tournament interruptions. All teams should be prepared to start their pool game up to 15 minutes early in case we are ahead of schedule (this is especially true for the 8am games!).
 - a. Pool Play Games can end in a tie at the end of regulation.
 - b. Bracket Play Games will go to ITB at the end of time limit or 7 innings until a winner is declared.
7. Specialty Rules:
 - a. Run cap per inning: A maximum of 6 runs can be scored each inning by a team. This will be for all pool, bracket, and championship games.
 - b. Pool games will never end before time has expired.
 - i. If the home team is down more than 6 runs, they'll finish the inning until 3 outs or 6 runs has been reached.
 - c. Game Run Rules: For pool play, there will not be any run rules, only the run cap per inning. For bracket play, we will follow run rules as follows:
 - i. 12 runs after 3 innings
 - ii. 10 runs after 4 innings
 - iii. 8 runs after 5 innings



GAME RULES ADDENDUM CONT'

8. Head coaches may consult with the umpires; volunteer coaches, players, sponsors and other parties are to keep out of discussions. The head coach is responsible for all communications, even those by other coaches.
9. No smoking, vaping, electronic cigarettes or tobacco use on the field or in the dugouts.
10. Batting Line-Up
 - a. Coaches will set a batting line-up once prior to the beginning of the first game in pool play then once again before the first bracket play game.
 - b. Coaches will also be allowed to reset their line-up one more time for the Championship game if wanted.
11. All players will bat in the line-up and are expected to hit unless they express otherwise. The batting line up will be set and continue to be revolving until re-set for bracket play.
 - a. Ex. If the 4th batter is the last out of the game, the 5th batter will lead off the next game.
12. If a player is forced to leave the game, the following protocol will be followed:
 - a. Injury:
 - i. Batter: If a batter cannot fulfill her time at bat due to injury or illness, that player will be eliminated from that entire game. Her spot will be skipped in the batting order. Teams will not be required to take an automatic out UNTIL they drop below 9 players.
 - ii. Runner: If a runner cannot continue her time on the bases, that player will be substituted with the last completed at bat. She will not be allowed to participate in the remainder of the game. The line-up will compress when her spot comes to bat.
 - b. Ejections: A player ejection while roster batting will result in the team losing that player for the entire game. Her spot in the batting order will be an automatic out.



GAME RULES ADDENDUM CONT'

13. Courtesy runner for pitcher and catcher, last completed at bat.
14. Due to all players being in the line-up, there will be free defensive substitutions.
15. The following procedure will be used to determine the seeding after pool play:
 - a. If three or more teams are tied with the same record in a division, head-to-head may or may not be used to break ties.
 - b. Once a level of tie-breaker is used, we DO NOT revert back to any steps of the tie-breaking procedure. We will continue on down the list until all ties are broken.
 - c. Highest Winning Percentage (number of wins divided by number of games with a result (ties eliminated from formula))
 - d. Most Wins
 - e. Head-to-Head Games
 - f. Runs allowed per game
 - g. Runs differential (+/- of 8 runs per game)
 - h. Coin Flip
 - i. Runs differential (+/- of 8 runs per game)
 - j. Coin Flip

CODE OF CONDUCT

The goal of the United States Specialty Sports Association (USSSA) is to offer our members a quality product in all aspects of the USSSA Programs. USSSA is committed to providing athletes the tools and the competitive platform by which they can accomplish their dreams in softball and in life. To this end we are committed to making the 2025 National All State Games a positive one, in terms of competitiveness and an overall enjoyable experience for everyone involved and that nothing which occurs during the operation of these games reflects negatively toward the USSSA, and the National All State Program.

- Parents and athletes will maintain high standards of moral and ethical conduct that includes self-control and responsible behavior. Both athletes and parents must display courtesy and good manners and consider the physical and emotional well-being of others.
- Parents and athletes will not swear, use abusive language, or display disruptive behavior, including behavior that is dangerous to self or others, including acts of violence, harassment, and physical or sexual abuse.
- Parents and players will respect the officials, coaches and event staff and their authority during the National All State Games. At no point will parents be allowed to confront coaches without the presence of a tournament director at a designated time and location away from any scheduled game.
- The head coach will be the sole decision maker in all aspects of the game. He/she will be the only person making the lineups, making changes to the lineup and determining all game management facets. At NO point will the parents have any say in how the game is managed or who is playing in the game.



CODE OF CONDUCT CONT'

- We give our coaches guidelines for creating lineups and doing their best to keep innings as equal as possible, however, this is a tournament, and they will be creating lineups to be competitive, with winning as a final goal. Coaches are NOT held to any rules on innings played, innings played at primary or secondary positions and/or lineup rotations.
- At NO point are parents allowed to approach coaches in an aggressive way for any circumstance.
- Parents are asked to stay away from the dugout during practices and games unless of an emergency situation or asked for assistance by the head coach.
- All head and assistant coaches must clear a USSSA background check.

USSSA and the National All State Games has a zero tolerance for non-compliance toward any of these rules. Failure to adhere to these or any other rules and procedures as set forth in an USSSA sanctioned event may result in actions taken against the individual held responsible. Such penalties include reprimands, probation, suspension (game, event, year or multi-year) or permanent expulsion from USSSA sanctioned events.



USSSA COMPLEX POLICIES

The following policies apply at all times:

- No firearms or weapons in the complex.
- No alcoholic beverages may be brought into the complex.
- No abusive behavior or foul language is permitted.
- No outside food may be brought into the complex.
- Must adhere to beverage policy.
- No bikes, scooters, skateboards, or other wheeled devices in the complex.
- The Space Coast Complex is a non-smoking facility.
- We are a dog friendly complex.
 - Leashes and Supervision: All pets must be on a leash or in a carrier and under control at all times while on the premises.
 - Animals are not permitted on any turf areas within the complex.
 - Clean-Up: Please clean up after your pet immediately. Waste disposal stations are provided throughout the complex.
 - Behavior: Pets should be well-behaved and not pose a threat or disturbance to other guests or pets. Excessive barking, aggression, or disruptive behavior may result in being asked to leave.
 - Health: Ensure your pet is up to date on vaccinations and in good health when visiting the complex.
 - Responsibility: Owners are fully responsible for their pets' actions, including any damage or injury they may cause.
- All coolers, bags, and purses are subject to search. The USSSA Space Coast Complex is managed on behalf of USSSA by the Sports Facilities Companies.

TURF AND BULLPEN RULES

- NO metal cleats, turf shoes only.
- NO liquids of any kind, other than water.
- NO food, beverages, gum or seeds of any kind.
- NO glass bottles or containers, no outside alcohol of any kind.
- NO sharp objects, including tent stakes or chairs.
- NO smoking.
- NO pets.

DUGOUT RULES

- NO gum or seeds of any kind.
- NO glass bottles or containers, no outside alcohol of any kind.
- NO smoking.
- NO pets.

For everyone's safety, dugouts, bullpens and fields are for team members only! Pets, children and spectators are prohibited from these areas.

Failure to follow these rules may result in forfeiting or removal from the Complex, and other sanctions in accordance with the USSSA Constitution.

FOOD AND BEVERAGE POLICY

Guests are welcome to bring personal water into the complex. However, all other outside food and beverages are not permitted. We appreciate your cooperation in adhering to this policy to ensure a safe and enjoyable experience for everyone.

Spectators are permitted to have 1 small cooler (size of an individual lunch box) with water, ice, and towels only or a 32oz cup.

Players are permitted to have 1 personal water jug up to 74oz in size and one small cooler (size of an individual lunch box) with water, ice, and towels only.

If a team decides to have a **team cooler**, they are allowed one cooler with water, ice, and towels only. A cooler band is required and will be distributed by tournament directors. Teams will not be allowed to bring in coolers until a team representative has checked in with the tournament director and has received the approved cooler band. Cooler bands must be attached to coolers and visible to event staff during the entirety of the event.

Guests who attempt to bring in any outside food or beverage other than water will be asked to leave the complex.

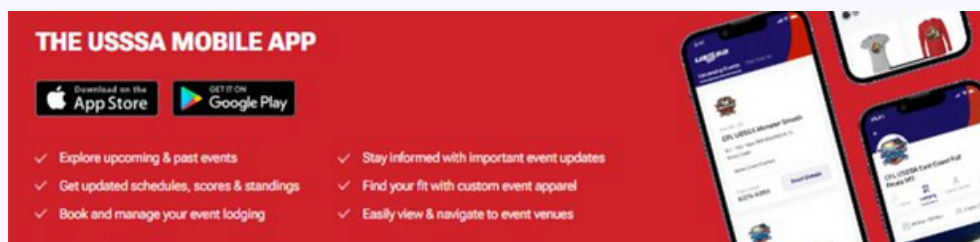
LOST AND FOUND

COMPLEX LIGHTNING WARNINGS

Welcome to Florida, the lightning capital of the world.

It does not have to be raining where you are for cloud to ground lightning to occur, especially around a sports complex with metal light poles, fencing, and large, open playing surfaces. **If alerted by the lightning detection system horn, the warning message over the public address system, or by Space Coast Complex staff, you must evacuate the complex.**

Participants and guests are not to reenter from their location of safety until the lightning warning has cleared, which will be signaled by the sounding of the horn, public address system message, and/or verbally by Space Coast Complex staff.

Guests and participants may seek shelter under the covered areas of the stadium concourse. Space Coast Stadium concessions may remain open, but all other field concessions and food trucks will stop serving during the lightning warnings to help facilitate the evacuation of the players and guests.

COMPLEX PARKING INSTRUCTIONS

Please review the following information about each parking lot, along with tips for parking in the best location based on your visit. See our map for additional details. Note that overflow parking and lot changes can occur. Please follow onsite signs and parking personnel for changes.

Red Parking Lot: enter from Stadium PKWY at the northern end of the complex. If your game is in the red quad, please park in the Red lot.

White Parking Lot: enter from Stadium PKWY in the middle of the complex. If your game is in the white quad, please park in the Red lot or White lot.

Blue Parking Lot: enter from Stadium PKWY in front of the stadium. If your game is in the Blue quad, Fastpitch or Space Coast Stadium, please park in the Blue lot or the White lot.

Junior Field Parking Lot: enter from Stadium PKWY at the southern end of the complex, the entrance is at the shipping/receiving sign. If your game is on the Junior Field, please park in the junior lot.

Fairgrounds Lot: This is our overflow parking area that is only used at approved times. The USSSA staff and signage will let you know when this lot is an option.

Tips:

- The Red Lot is our largest parking lot. It provides the largest number of spots. If you cannot find a spot, check this lot. Do not park on the grass along Stadium Parkway (outside the fence) at any time.
 - You are subjected to be towed or ticketed.
- Do not block or park at the entrances/ exits or in front of gates.
- Do not remove cones to park.
- Do not park in the employee parking area.
